The creed is recited on a daily basis, encouraging students to make the right choices. These concepts are also incorporated in our daily character curriculum.

The Creed

- We are in one boat, we must row together.
- If I want a helping hand, I will first look to the end of my own arm.
- I have the right to fail; I do not have the right to take my teacher or my classmates with me.
- Our parents and teachers can only open the door to an education. To be successful, I must choose to walk through.
- Reading is to my mind what exercise is to my body.
- I will nurture great thoughts for I will never go higher than I think.
- Success does not come to me, I go to it.
- Step by step, I will ascend the stairs to success, and if I fall seven times on the stairs, I will stand up the eighth time.
- A good habit is my best friend.
- When I ask a question I am a fool for a moment, but if I do not ask a
 question I will be a fool forever.
- If we do not struggle, we will not progress.
- Not to know is bad, but not to wish to know is worse.
- My knowledge is a jewel. My knowledge is my great riches. It cannot be destroyed by others. It cannot be stolen by thieves. I cannot lose knowledge by giving it away.
- My character is determined by me doing the right thing when no one is looking.
- No act of our kindness, no matter how small, is ever wasted therefore:

We do all the good we can,
By all the means we can,
In all the ways we can,
In all the places we can,
At all the times we can,
To all the people we can,
As long as ever we can.
